As it honours one of Canada's greatest writers and her essential inheritance – writing, so it also proclaims its vocation as a community

cultural institution, in which writing serves to strengthen the identity of Manitoba's francophone community.

Writing is, of course, an expression of oneself, but it is also a form of producing and creating oneself, and of creating and of discovering one's voice. That is why the writer-in-residence project, which embodies this vision, is central to the renown of Maison Gabrielle-Roy. Thank you for your support! Enjoy the Newsletter!

GABRIELLE'S ESSENCE

Every time I arrive at Maison Gabrielle-Roy, whether on a Saturday afternoon or in the early evening on any given day of the week, I take a tour through the house; the floors squeak as my eyes dwell on the rich patinas of the wood.

Without fail, every time, I jump in surprise! Whether in the kitchen, or in one of the upstairs rooms, out of the corner of my eye, I catch sight of Mélina or one of her daughters, at work or just getting into bed... mannequins in period costumes (dating back to the early 1900's). To some extent, these are the images and emotions this writer's residence conjures up. This is work that I am very familiar with... writing page after page, reading stories, and facilitating workshops. But here, within

the walls of the museum, there is always a surprise waiting for me... at any given time, and place, when I least expect it. Perhaps because I have more free time here, perhaps because there is a sense of Gabrielle's presence, as well as her family's, my writing is more productive and my meetings are more intense.

What have I accomplished to date? Well! I'm continuing to work on my historical novel—this being the first volume (the story begins in 1837 in Lower Canada, taking us to Spain, France and Western Canada); I've started writing a short story based on a trip I recently

took to New Orleans); I'm pursuing my work on a triptych of sculptures to be paired with a series of poems on trees (trees being the link between earth and sky, between the concrete and the spiritual worlds); in winter and spring, I facilitated two series of writing workshops—the first based on the short story, and the second based on the haiku.

In December 2010, I met with students in the course on poetry writing taught by Lise Gaboury-Diallo (CUSB) and in March I met with students in Sandrine Hallion-Brès' course on creative writing. I am pursuing my work as mentor for budding authors and I attended Suzanne Kennelly's reading of her script for *La Visite chez Mélina*. It is a gem!

The return of Génies en herbe-

Segments of the first episode of <u>Génies en herbe: l'aventure</u> were recorded at Maison Gabrielle-Roy on October 2nd, 2010 and aired on Radio-Canada on January 8th, 2011. This legendary program, created in the early 70's was re-invented and re-instated after a 13 year hiatus. In its new version, young contestants take part in a race which was a great opportunity for promoting the museum.

Vous m'en lirez tant -

On January 29th, 2010, Maison Gabrielle-Roy was host to the team from the radio show *Vous m'en lirez tant* for the taping of a show about francophone literature in Manitoba. Amongt the guests were authors Bertrand Nayet, Simone Chaput, France Adams, Annette Saint-Pierre and Lise Gaboury-Diallo. In addition, editors, Roger Léveillé (Éd. du Blé) and Huguette Le Gall (Éd. des Plaines) were present.

A few days after the recording, the show's director, Claude Godin, sent a note to Maison Gabrielle-Roy highlighting...: "The whole crew of Vous m' en lirez tant thanks you for the warm welcome you gave us on our recent visit to Maison Gabrielle-Roy. The restoration of this house should be a model for all sites of historical and cultural importance to francophone Canada. I want you to know that is was a very moving visit for us and we hope that we have done something to make both the house and Franco-Manitoban literature better known, and that it will have an impact-however small- on the rest of Canada."

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

Chez Gabrielle - On March 15. 2011. Maison Gabrielle-Rov hosted an evening of readings when the public had a unique opportunity to hear three women from Manitoba-distinguished authors-read excerpts from their works. Annette Saint-Pierre, Simone Chaput and Anne Sechin made up the trio of authors who participated in this event facilitated by Bertrand Nayet.

Writing Workshop "the short

story" - The workshops which took place during the winter of 2010 and spring of 2011, will leave an impression... and not only on the participants who attended the workshops. The four short stories written during the course of the project were of such quality that they have been selected for publication in the next issue of the Cahiers francocanadiens de l'Ouest.

Gabrielle Roy Brunch - Just over 100 people attended the Brunch at the Norwood Hotel on March 20th. The event, an annual fundraiser, allowed the museum to raise \$2,743 for its operating expenses. Plan to attend next year!


At this time, the event is offered in French only.

ANDRÉ VISIT WITH BROTHER

Excerpt from Street of Riches by Gabrielle Roy (trad. Harry L. Binsse, Toronto, McClelland & Stewart, 1957).

" ... and the Naults went as far as to offer us an expedition to Saint-Joseph's Oratory, Its major purpose, I imagine, was to see Brother André. That poor wonderworker sat from morning till night on a straight-backed chair, his head in his hands, listening to the appeals and prayers of the vast crowd filing past him. Many sought to be cured by him; others wanted only to see if he looked like a saint; and

perhaps a few hoped for no more than his understanding. You could not help feeling sorry for Brother André; almost the whole while he kept his face a little hidden; one might have thought that he had a headache, or that he himself felt sad at not being understood by everyone. Certainly he had little time to reply to all the people for every day, it would seem, there came as many as on the day we went. Now it was Maman's turn. She asked Brother André whether it was a great sin for a married woman to leave on a journey without having

obtained her husband's consent. Perhaps Brother André did not hear properly. He hastily replied to Maman: "Say a good prayer to Saint-Joseph, don't drink too much coffee, and have trust, always have trust.""

375 Deschambault Street is the house where Gabrielle Roy was born in 1909, and lived until she left Manitoba to travel in Europe in 1937. Now restored as a museum, it is designated both a Provincial and a National Historic Site and houses a collection of objects and artifacts associated with Gabrielle Roy and her family during the years 1909-1937. The museum enables young people, researchers and the general public to learn more about the author herself, her works and her influence. Maison Gabrielle-Roy is also an important cornerstone of the cultural development of St.Boniface.
